The Award is marked by a hand crafted slate plaque to be displayed at Fairlight End.


Chris Hutt said "This Award, which we are proud to win, is really a tribute to all the people who have helped us to build up the garden in the 10 years we have been here."

PETT PARISH PLAN - FINAL REVIEW - Judith Dean (PPC Chair)

In 2010 a survey of residents was carried out and based on the results a parish action plan was developed. This plan was distributed to all households in Pett and Pett Level and presented to the Parish Council to help provide a framework for forward planning.



In the June 2015 meeting of the Parish Council it was agreed that a final review of this plan be undertaken with the intent of reporting

back on how the items identified have been progressed. It may be that from this review other opportunities are identified, but this final review is not intended to result in a replacement parish plan.

Commencing at the August council meeting, and each month thereafter, each of the nine topics covered by the plan will be reviewed, with a final wrap-up review at the end.

We need your input to ensure that the future PettNet best meets the expectations and needs of our community.



PETT LEVEL RESCUE BOAT - Steve Hill, Chairman



As I mentioned in the last edition we were presented by The New Beach Club with a marvellous cheque for just over £1,300. This money will be used

to equip every crew member with their own individual 'teddie' a thermal fleece onesie, and also, hopefully, a couple of new life jackets. This will mean that all crew members will have, and be responsible for, their own personal kit.

We have also had the official naming of our new small boat, this was carried out by our local MP Mrs Amber Rudd. The boat was named after Mr John Pettifer, aka JP, who joined the rescue boat in the late 1970s and was an active member for approximately 20 years. John sadly died earlier this year. The boat was especially designed and developed for shallow-water rescue, which will be very useful if called to Camber Sands!

On Sunday the 5th July the main rescue boat was called out on two occasions, in both incidents a member of the public had dialled 999 and got through to the Coast Guards. The first call was to a yacht reportedly in difficulties off Winchelsea Beach, after investigation nothing was found to be amiss. The second was to a jet ski that was thought to have broken down; when the rescue boat came alongside all was found to be well. We had no problem with either incident as it 'better to be safe than sorry'.

FOLLOW THE PLOT – Libby Rothwell

Pett Village Allotments Association

One of the most troublesome diseases affecting potatoes and outdoor tomatoes in recent years is blight, a scourge which can destroy your healthy plants in a matter of days. The disease is caused by a fungus-like organism which spreads rapidly from the foliage to the stems, fruit and tubers causing brown rot and decay.

August's warm, humid evenings and hot daytime temperatures provide just the right conditions for a blight attack. These danger times, called Smith Periods, occur when for at least two consecutive days, the minimum air temperature has been 10° C. and there's been a minimum of 11 hours of at least 90% relative humidity.

Now there is a free service all growers can subscribe to: Blightwatch.co.uk. Once you've submitted your details including your postcode, you receive an alert every time there's a high risk of blight in your area so you can take preventative action. The RHS lists a number of non-chemical control measures against potato blight including removing and burning affected material promptly and earthing up tubers for added protection. If the damage has spread to the stems, cut off the stalks near the ground and clear away the debris, then leave the tubers for the skins to harden for a fortnight before lifting and storing them.



THE PETT FALLEN

An occasional series to commemorate the men of Pett who died in the Great War.

Henry Charles Beeching



Henry Charles Beeching was born in Guestling in 1889, the son of Luke and Ellen Beeching. In 1911 he was one of 11 children living at home in Rose Cottage, Pett Road, Fairlight.

In September 1914 he enlisted as a Private, G/1716, in the 2nd Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment in Hastings, and after training went overseas on 1 May 1915.

On the 9 May 1915 the 2nd Battalion took part in the battle of Aubers Ridge losing more than 275

men, and then went into rest. Henry Beeching was probably amongst a draft of 120 replacements who arrived at the front on 11 May. The rest of May, June, July and the first half of August were fairly quiet, with relatively few casualties. The battalion alternated between front line duties and training in the Bethune area.

From the Battalion War Diary, which records events in the line:

Vermelles

24 August The Bn relieved the London Scottish in Section Y3 (trenches).

25 August 2nd Lieuts Cook and Collins joined and left on the 26th August to join the 5th R Sussex Regt.

27 August 2nd Lieut J. Dugrelle joined the Bn. from the base.

28 August The Bn was relieved by 10th Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, and we billeted in VERMELLES, where we provided various digging parties and fatigues. 7 killed and 2 wounded during trench period.

2 of these men had been killed on 26 August, one of whom was Henry Beeching. He is buried in plot VI.C.18 of Vermelles British Cemetery. He was awarded the 1915 Star, the British War Medal, and the Victory Medal.

He is commemorated in Pett Church and on the War Memorial, and also in Pett Methodist Chapel and Fairlight Church.


William Brooman

William Brooman was born in Hastings to John and Caroline Brooman on 15th October 1871. After leaving school he was employed as a labourer until he joined the Navy on 20th October 1886 as Boy, Second Class. On 14th December the following year he was rated Boy, First Class. On his 18th birthday he signed on for 12 years as an Ordinary Seaman, and was promoted to Able Bodied Seaman (AB) on 25th September 1891. He served on various ships and in 1899 he became a Leading Seaman.

In May 1900 he transferred to the Coastguard Service as a Boatman, and served at various stations along the South Coast, finally ending up at Toot Rock, in Pett Level, in January 1914. He was here until 29 July when, with war being imminent, he was recalled to sea.

On August 8th 1915 he was serving on HMS India when she was torpedoed off the coast of Norway. William Brooman was one of 160 men who were killed. 141 men were taken ashore and interned for the remainder of the war

William Brooman is commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial. He is also remembered on the Pett War Memorial, in Pett Church, and in Pett Methodist Chapel




He was awarded the 1914-15 Star, the British War Medal, and the Victory Medal.

From official sources:

HMS INDIA, armed merchant cruiser. 8 August 1915. On patrol off the Norwegian coast to intercept iron ore carriers sailing from Narvik for Germany via Rotterdam. At 1740, alarm gong sounded, and track of a torpedo fired by submarine U.22 (Bruno Hoppe), was seen approaching. It could not be avoided and struck starboard side aft near No.3 gun, ship immediately started to settle by stern. Of the four starboard and three port boats kept lowered for such an emergency, six were successfully manned but with ship's way still on, a port boat capsized and on the starboard side the boats were fouled or stove in, ship sank in five minutes, 6-7 miles NNW of Heligver Light near Bodo.

10 officers and 150 ratings lost, 141 survivors including Commander Kennedy. Survivors picked up by Swedish SS Gotaland and HM Trawler Saxon and landed in Norway where they were interned until the end of the war.

PETT LEVEL NATURALISTS SOCIETY – Brenda Kirkham

On Saturday 20th June Pettnats had an outing to Brede High Woods. This woodland has a mixture of habitats, chief of which is heathland and woodland and the number of species we recorded makes it a bit of a biodiversity hotspot. At one point Lynne Jenkins stepped towards the long grass in an open area and was amazed by the number of insects suddenly jumping and fly

area and was amazed by the number of insects suddenly jumping and flying around. Most of the bird life was detected by identifying calls, great tits, blackcaps, long-tailed tits and thrushes to name a few.

There is a huge range of plant life in Brede High Woods, everything from hornbeam and chestnut coppice to the smallest plants like milkworts and speedwell. Although only six members were able to come we had a really enjoyable time with our excellent guide Alan Kenworthy. We will be having two more walks next year and hope more members will be able to come.

We will not be meeting again until 25th September when Sue Dengate will talk about flowers on the stage. This should prove to be a very interesting talk. Please do come along and support us. Annual subscriptions will be due and visitors are always welcome.

NATURE NOTES - Alan Kenworthy

'How did you spot that?' is a question I'm often asked when I see something interesting in the undergrowth. Indeed, it is a question I've often asked others when they have found something I didn't see. The simple answer 'Well, I was looking for it.' - is rarely true. Most of the time when you spot something, it is because you saw some movement



that attracted your attention. Walking round Rye Harbour reserve, out of the corner of my eye I caught sight of a bird flying into a tree, and heard a familiar call. I scanned the tree for a while before I saw the barred breast of a cuckoo. The cuckoo rarely sings on an open perch and often tucks itself in amongst leafy branches, which explains why many more people have heard a cuckoo than have ever seen one. So when I pointed it out to my companion, they said – 'How did you spot that?'

When it comes to the insect world, you may well spot some movement – a butterfly opening its wings, for example. But insects are very wary of predators which may also spot movement, so they tend to keep still as far as possible. If you are interested in insects then there is a tendency to walk slowly and scan bushes or the ground, and quite often you may not be aware of how you saw one. It may have been a shadow on a leaf, or a tiny splash of a colour other than green. (Or it may be green like the tortoise beetle that looks just like a flat blister on the surface of the leaf!) Just recently I saw my first woundwort shieldbug - Eysarcoris venustissimus. Now, before you congratulate me, you'll probably want to know what a woundwort shieldbug is. It is a bit like the common green shieldbug that you'll find on your runner beans sucking the juices from them. It is smaller though, in fact it is only about 6 millimetres long. (That's quarter of an inch in old money.) It also has exquisite purpley bronze colouring on its back and shoulders, and a black and white connexivum. (Entomologists like to give posh names to various bits of their chosen group of insects and connexivum is shorter than saying the pie-crust edging round the back and sides of the abdomen of a shieldbug, and I wish I'd never mentioned it now!)

It's a beautiful insect though, and I certainly can't say I was looking for it, because before I saw it I didn't even know that they existed, and it was just the magnification provided by the camera's viewfinder that allowed me to identify it as a shieldbug. It was only when I got the photos back home, and looked it up in the field guides that I knew exactly what it was. It is called the woundwort shieldbug because it lays its eggs on hedge woundwort and the nymphs feed on the leaves. Hedge woundwort is an attractive plant with spikes of purple flowers and horrible smelling leaves. Plants that have ...wort in their name were once used medicinally, so woundwort was probably once used to heal wounds. The woundwort shieldbug also lays its eggs on white dead-nettle which is closely related to woundwort.

The eggs hatch out into nymphs, which is a shieldbug's way of getting round all that dangerous caterpillar and chrysalis stuff that many other insects go through. The nymphs are mobile and more or less similar to the adult insect, but smaller and they can't fly or reproduce. To grow they have to shed their old exoskeleton and puff themselves up to expand the soft skeleton underneath, which then hardens again. They will go through several of these instars, as each stage is called, before they emerge from the last stage as an adult with wings and reproductive bits.

So how did I spot it? – I haven't a clue. I was looking for bumblebees at the time. Maybe I just knew that there was something beautiful and interesting down there, because I find that if you keep your eyes open, there usually is.

DO YOU KNOW about the Beautiful Stained Glass Window in Pett Church?

Hidden away in the vestry is probably the most beautiful stained glass window in St. Mary & St. Peter Church, Pett. The small rectangular window was given in memory of Eva Mary Young, wife of the Rev. F.C.A. Young who was rector from 1909 to 1930. It was designed and made by Philip Cole of Fairlight, whose signature appears at the bottom of the window. Eva was born in November 1870 and died on the 22nd of February 1909, only a short time before her husband came to Pett.

The window shows the Madonna and child and has A.D. D.G. inscribed at the bottom together with, "In loving memory, Eva Mary Young'. The window was put in the church in 1920 and is a real gem in a church with some other interesting stained glass, especially when the sun shone through the stained glass.

Frederick Charles Ashburnham Young was born on the 14th July 1867. He was the son of Frederick Young, Pett's Rector between 1857 and 1882 and knew the village very well as a child. He was educated at University College, Durham and was ordained priest in 1896. Before coming to serve in Pett, Frederick Charles was a curate in Lincolnshire, Norfolk and at St. John the Evangelist, Upper St. Leonards. It was in Lincolnshire that he met his wife Eva Mary. They had four children, Alan, Derek, Kathleen and Edie, but tragedy visited the family just before Frederick came to Pett as its Rector when Eva Mary died.


What a sad start to a long incumbency in this parish (1909 – 1930). Having just lost his wife Frederick had to deal with all the intricacies of a new parish, which included meeting many new people, and coping with a very young family. He grieved greatly and must have spent much time in the church vestry near the 'little window' after it was installed. F.C.A. Young died on the 11th September 1938.

Eva was a very attractive lady and the family had been very happy. Here you see them in 1905 in a typical Edwardian scene. So next time you visit St. Mary & St.

Peter's church, do have a look in the vestry, admire the beautiful stained glass window and remember the Young family, who gave so much to the parish of Pett – and Eva Mary, to whom the window is dedicated.

NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

This is the second of what I now hope will be a regular feature (produced by either Judith Dean or myself) reporting on items discussed at recent Parish Council meetings, the approved minutes of which are posted on PettNet and on the village noticeboard the day after the following meeting.

Pett Sport Pavilion: The Parish council has now taken over the pavilion project with the aim of upgrading the current pavilion by the start of next summer. The design, and anticipated cost, has now been reduced but there still remains a shortfall of funding. It will not be until the August parish council meeting when actual costs and funding are known and it is hoped that a decision on how best to proceed can be taken at that meeting.

Recreation Ground drainage issues: Flash flooding from the recreation ground occurs several times a year. This flooding not only impacts sports and playground facilities, but also impacts Gatehurst Farm which borders the ground. Discussions have been on-going as to the best way to provide drainage to the recreation ground and costs are currently being investigated.

Transparancy Code: As from July this year all parish councils have a statutory requirement to publish on the internet agendas, minutes, budgets and accounts. Sarah Willoughby, our Clerk, has been working with David Penfold, Lucy Hogg (who has volunteered to support our website activities) and Peter Wiggins to make this happen. By the time that you read this you will have access to these items on the current PettNet website.

PettNet Website: The council has now taken over responsibility for PettNet and is running a project to look at how this key village asset can be re-invigorated for the on-going benefit of our community and seeks your views on what this can look like.

2010 Pett Parish Plan: We agreed to hold a final review of this plan over the coming months and again your views are sought.

More detail about how to comment on the future of PettNet and the 2010 Parish Plan can be found elsewhere in this magazine.

Please don't forget that if you have any concerns or issues that you want aired, or have any ideas that may benefit our community, then you can either talk to one of your councilors, write to the parish council via our Clerk, or turn up to public time at our council meetings.



Deceptive currents

Some years ago while visiting in hospital I was asked if I could spend some time with a very agitated lady who was terminally ill with throat cancer. She was unable to speak so we communicated by her squeezing my hand - one squeeze for 'no', two for 'yes'.

I had no idea what might be troubling her, so eventually I asked if she was afraid of death. She replied 'yes'. I asked if she knew God. Her answer was 'no'. I asked if she would like to know God. She replied 'yes'. Out loud, I prayed a prayer that God would forgive all her sin, fill her with His presence, reveal Himself to her and give her His peace. When I finished I asked if she understood the prayer and if she had prayed it for herself. Her reply was 'yes'. We communicated a little longer before I left.

Two days later I returned to see how she was getting on, but she was gone. She had died a few hours after my visit, but the nurses said,

"We don't know what you said, but it worked - she changed and was so peaceful."

Some might say it was coincidence that brought me to the hospital at that time, and for the nurses to make their request, and for me to identify what was troubling the woman. But I believe God knew the woman's anguish. He prompted me to visit the hospital and prompted the nurses to make their request. He then guided me to ask the right questions and gave the woman the peace she needed.

How about you? Do you need peace? Do you know where you are going when you die? Does your life have purpose? Are you happy with the person you have become? If your answer is 'no' to any of these questions, the chances are you lack peace. Busyness and activity will not bring the peace or purpose you need. Real peace is a gift from God and comes from knowing Him. It is a peace that increases the closer we get to Him.

Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

If you would like this peace, all you need do is humble yourself and ask God.




