PARISH COUNCIL NEWS - SEPTEMBER 2007

The August meeting of Pett Parish Council was held on Tuesday 21st August at Pett Village Hall. The Annual Accounts for 2006/2007 were approved and a copy can be obtained from the Parish Clerk Members also approved the Annual Return for submission to the Council's external auditor - the Annual Return can be inspected by contacting the Parish Clerk. The waste recycling system was still causing some concern and it was hoped that initial difficulties would soon be remedied. The Parish Council would continue to monitor the situation and if necessary make representations to Rother DC if problems persisted.

Rother District Councillor Roger Bird informed Council that as a result of the situation concerning the Two Sawyers PH. Rother DC had been asked to remove the waste recycling units from the site. Following detailed discussion it was agreed to ask the village hall Management Committee if they would provide a temporary site until more detailed consideration could be given to the matter. Rother District Councillor Robin Pattern informed Council also spoke about the recent developments at the Two Sawyers PH and it was hoped that the development of housing on the site would soon be improved. Concern was expressed about the state of the recycling bins and the area in general and it was agreed that a substantial improvement would be required if the bins were to be re-located elsewhere in the village. Do you have any views on this matter; if so, please send them to the Parish Clerk.

The Parish Council, following examination of other Local Councils Action Plans,

agreed to consider undertaking a Plan for Pett and Pett Level if there appeared to be sufficient local interest in such a Plan. The object of a Local Plan is for the local community to identify the sort of community they want to see in the years ahead and to prepare a plan of action to achieve this. The Plan should reflect the concern and aspirations of all of the community and should be developed by the Community. If you would like to know more, or even better, would be prepared to help develop a Plan, please contact the Parish Clerk, The Plan must be a working document that is reviewed on a regular basis and updated as required.

Parish Council approved a procedure for dealing with public time and a recertiflog of reports/questions and comments from elected representatives and members of the public can now be inspected at Council meetings.

The Parish Council considered the following Planning applications and agreed to support the proposals on each application:-

RR/2007/1808/P — 6 Old Ceestguard Cottages, Pett Level — Rebuilding of existing dwelling including associated extensions, dormers and roof lights.

RR/2007/2036/P — Napenthe, Pett Level Road, Pett Level — demolition of existing dwelling and erection of new dwelling including deck area.

RR/2007/2075/P - Mulberry Cettage, Toot Rock, Pett Level - Part demolition of existing bunker and erection of single storey extension.

RR/2007/2190/P - Fairlight Wood Caravan Club site, Watermill Lane - provision of 10 additional all weather caravan pitches.

The Parish Council objected to the following application as it was considered to be over development of the site and that it would also cause potential additional traffic hazard at this location:-

RR/2007/1975/P - 1 Rose Cottage. Land adjacent, Pett Road, Pett - Outline: erection of a pair of semi-detached chalet bungalows and formation of new vehicular access.

RR/2007/1268/P Gatehurst Cottage Pett Road, Pett (erection of new chimney to rear of property)

RR/2007/1546/P Hilltop, Chick Hill, Pett Level (erection of single storey living room extension)

Granted

RR/2007/2909/O Caravelle, Chick Hill, Pett Level (lawful use of the land for the stationing of one mobile structure for permanent residential purposes)

Granted

RR/2007/1697/P Pax,Pett Road, Pett (proposed loft conversion with dormers front and rear)

Granted

RR/2007/1795/P Highfield, Chick Hill, Pett (new rear dormer to existing roof and formationof a veranda/canopy on south elevation)

Granted

At the top he stopped again and watched the sheep, who took no notice of him whatsoever. Then he trotted right along the skyline and eventually disappeared amongst the trees. Had I been a hunter armed with a rifle, he would have been an easy shot for nearly a minute. He will have to learn discretion very quickly if he wants to see his first birthday.

The weather this year has been so odd that all sorts of plants are blooming out of season. I had a cowslip in flower at the end of August.

I am sad to say that my blackbird was almost certainly killed in the July hailstorm. He used to come to the kitchen door daily for currants, but I haven't seen him at all since the storm. No doubt another male will claim the territory next spring, and it will be interesting to see whether he too will become tame.

The hedgerows are full of blackberries. I pick a few most days on my way home, and now have half a drawer full in my freezer. On a grotty grey day in February a blackberry crumble brings back happy memories of these lovely autumn days.

The rabbits have myxomatosis again. There are dead and dying rabbits all over the place. I have read that this horrible disease was deliberately introduced to this country. If so, I hope that the person responsible died slowly something very nasty, like the rabbits. If you come across a myxi rabbit and are able to kill it, you will be performing an act of mercy.

Now is the time to clean out your nestboxes and put in a handful of clean hay, wool, or combings from your dog. If we get a cold winter, a cosy roosting box can be a real life saver.

As usual with these events there is so much 'behind scenes' organisation involved. for which we all say great big 'thank If you missed it this year, you'. make absolutely certain you don't next.

The tides have been right recently for the beach nets to be laid. Have you spotted them at low tide pegged in circles on the sand? They have to be watched carefully when the tides recede as if you aren't sharp enough getting down to them to retrieve your catch the seagulls will be there first. Early one morning, before the water was low enough for him to reach the net, Jack had to watch one of our resident seals helping himself to a very hearty breakfast. You have to hold a licence to fish in this manner. but you can fish by from a boat line and have yourself a healthy supper of mackerel or herring. Some local fishermen have their own Smokers

HALIBUT

Halibut is the largest of all flatfish (it may reach a length of 2m/ 7' and weigh up to 325kg/ 720lb.) and is available year round. The meat is low in fat, white, firm and mild flavoured. Both fresh and frozen halibut is usually sold in fillets or steaks. Halibut needs careful cooking as it can easily dry out, and is probably best prepared in plenty of liquid, such as melted butter or olive oil for basting, and served with a sauce.

Baked halibut fillet with watercress crème fraiche sauce

1 x 500g/ 18oz tub full fat crème fraiche
1 bag or bunch of fresh watercress, washed, picked over and dried with the toughest stalks discarded
4 x 175g/ 6oz halibut fillets
25g/ 1oz unsalted butter
½ lemon
Seasoning
2 sprigs flat leaf parsley

To make the sauce, place half the crème fraiche in a blender and add the prepared watercress. Whiz together on the pulse setting of the mixer. Add the remaining crème fraiche and whiz again (still on pulse) until all is blended together well. Do not blend too much as it will turn to cheese. Put into a container, add seasoning to taste, cover and refrigerate until ready to use.

For the hallbut, butter a suitable ovenproof dish. Scatter with 2 slices of lemon and sprigs of parsley and season lightly. Place the fish in the dish in a single layer and spaced apart. Season the fish lightly and squeeze a few drops of lemon juice from the remaining piece of lemon on top of each piece of fish. Carefully cover the whole dish with a sheet of foil. Try to avoid the foil touching the fish. Make sure the dish is sealed completely around the edges. Place the dish in the centre of a pre-heated oven 376F/ 190C/ Gas 5. Bake for 15 – 20 minutes, depending on the thickness of the fillet.

To serve, reheat the watercress creme fraiche slowly in a small saucepan. Remove the fish dish from the oven. Carefully remove the foil and spoon some of the cooking juices into a small jug (do not include the herbs etc.). Loosely cover the fish with the foil and keep in a warm place. Add the fish juices to the sauce and stir well. When completely warmed through, check for seasoning and consistency. Take care not to let the sauce overheat and split. You may want to add a little cream of the sauce seems too thick.

Lift each piece of halibut on to warmed plates and pour the sauce around the fish. Serve with baby new potatoes and fresh mange-touts, sugar snap peas and fine beans, or with a watercress, chicory, orange and fresh herb salad dressed with a classic vinalgrette.

DO YOU KNOW?

Do you know that a retired naval lieutenant was one of the earliest people to come to Pett to live out his life in this village? In other words, one of the first 'outlanders'.

Choyce Moyses owed his strange name to his mother Sarah, whose maiden name had been Choyce. He was baptised at Southwark in March 1787 and entered the navy when he was a boy. At the age of 16 he was a midshipman on the sixty-four gun 'Utrecht' which had a compliment of four hundred and ninety men. Soon after he served on the frigate 'Pomone' off the coast of Spain. It was while taking passage back to Pomone Portsmouth on the 'Blanche' he was shipwrecked in a violent storm off the island of Ushant . Forty five men were drowned but Choyce Moyses was rescued and taken prisoner by the French. He spent most of his imprisonment in the fortress of Verdun and was eventually released after the Battle of Waterloo in 1815.

We know nothing of his life after the war until 1828, when he was described as a 'Keeper of a Receptacle for Lunatics at Tooting Graveney [the mind boggles, doesn't It?]. Moyses was brought before the justices at Wandsworth accused of being the father of an illegitimate child. The three month old baby, William, was a charge on the parish and Moyses was ordered to pay four shillings and sixpence (22 1/2 p) weekly towards the maintenance. By 1837 Movses was living in Bloomsbury, but by the time he

married in 1845 his address was in Westminster. His wife, Elizabeth was a widow with two daughters and was fourteen years younger than her second husband.

Soon after their marriage Choyce and Elizabeth Movses came to Sussex and moved into Pett Lodge. Sadly their time together was short as Moyses died on the 15th October1853, aged sixty six. Elizabeth spent the next 30 years as a widow in Pett. living with her servant Cecilia Bartholomew (of Battle). She was quite well provided as Choyce had left her £768 and a pension of £50 a year as a lieutenant's widow. Cecillia too was left interest on £200 for life, provided she was still employed by Mrs Moyses at the time of her death. The two ladies did much to help the sick and the poor in the village. Elizabeth's daughters, Louisa Christie died at Eastbourne in 1886 and is buried in Pett churchyard with the Moyses. Elizabeth died at the age of eighty-three in 1885.

Though Choyse was a bit of a rogue in the years after the war with the French, both he and his wife were admired and respected in Pett. They were an early example of folk coming to live in the village at a time when most of the residents were either farmers or agricultural labourers. On the south wall of St. Mary & St. Peter church there is a white marble tablet affixed to the wall in memory of the Choyces'. Underneath it are the words 'Universally respected'. You can't ask much more than that, can you?
