

All hail the power of Jesu's Name Let Angels prostrate fall, Bring forth the royal diadem And crown Him Lord of all.



'CROWN HIM LORD OF ALL'

THERE ARE SOME hymn writers renowned for their great contribution to our hymnody - names such as the Wesleya or John Mason Neale immediately spring to mind. Similarly there are composers of the tunes (always so important in establishing the popularity of any hymn) e.g. Bach, Dykes or Monk etc. On the other hand there are authors and composers remembered today for just one hymn or tune only. This is certainly the case with 'CROWN HIM LORD OF ALL' . the Ascensiontide hymn par excellence. The author was Edward Perronet (1786-1792) a product of the great Evangelical Revival of the 18th Century. Wesley himself thought highly of him for he knew very well that to write a good hymn was no easy task and his judgement has been confirmed by the few that have remained from among the vast number written at this time by all and sundry.

ALLHAILTHE POWER OF JESUS NAME first appeared in the Gospel Magazine in 1780 and was quickly recognised as a really great hymn, in fact Perronet, son of the Vicer of Sundridge (Kent), like many others of his day for sook the Church of his fathers and annoyed Wesley by publishing a very hersh satire on the Church of England in which he referred to it as 'a tottering edifice which I despise' - shades of today's popular Pressi (John and Charles Wesley both remained loyal Anglicans at the time). Perronet attached himself to a strongly Calvinistic Sectionown as 'The Countess of Huntingdon's Connexion'. Later still he became an Independant minister at Canterbury where he died at

the age of 66. He had an adventurous life. On one occasion at Bolton he was set upon by the mob and rolled in the mud. At Canterbury he met William Shrubsole formerly a chorister at the Cathedrai (and one time organist at Bangor Cathedral) but likewise now disenchanted with the 'C of E' - Shrubsole wrote a stirring tune for Perronet's verses called 'Miles Lane' -Elgar said he considered it the finest hymn tune in the English heritage. The names of Perronet and Shrubsole are now largely forgotten but their fine hymn remains and retains its affection amongst Christians of all denominations. The 'C of E' was much kinder in the end than either of its critics, for it allowed Perronet to be buried in Canterbury Cathedral cloisters. All is past now and they are together (we hope) in the presence of the glorified Lord. To sum up - CROWN HIM LORD OF ALL is indeed a great hymn of praise to the Risen and Ascended Christ (drawing on the imagery of the Book of Revelation) and speaking of - 'King of Kings and Lord of Lords', angels, saints and martyrs and all redeemed mankind paying tribute to the Lord of all. The complete wording was subsequently revised in 1787 by Dr. John Rippon, a Baptist minister who called it the Christian 'Coronation Hymn of Jesus'. Whilst 'Miles Lane' is indeed a great tune still rightly sung in many of our churches today, many also believe the Welsh have an even finer tune 'Diadent'.

CHRISTIAN AID

Christian Aid's Director, Michael Taylor, writes about "A kind of resurrection" which he witnessed in an ashram (religious community) he visited near Delhi in India:

He noticed the ashram gates immediately, despite the noise. They were made of iron: tall, strong and rather handsome. The noise came from a crowd of boys, chanting songs and banging drums.

Only months before these boys had been all but dead. Coming from desperately poor homes, they were handed over as children to carpet-makers, and that was almost the last that was heard of them. They were taken far away, and taught how to knot carpets sitting at a frame for hours on end. Eyes straining in poor light, lungs filling with dust, fingers sore, they were virtually slaves.

Mukti Pratishthan is an Indian organisation supported by the churches through Christian Aid. In the last few years they have become expert at tracking down these lost children and freeing them from carpet factories. They take them to the ashram, feed them up, and put some brightness back in their eyes.

The ashram is also temporary home to adults who have been freed from virtual slave labour. They are taught another trade, so that they can go back to their villages with money in their pockets.

The men he met had helped build the ashram where they were staying, with its workshops, kitchen, dormitories, washrooms and cool courtyard area for meeting and prayer. It was the same men who had made the iron gates, and the children, freed from carpet factories, who sang as they opened them.

Isn't that a story worth telling in Christian Aid Week? The week is May 16th-21st: may we ask for your support? There will be a house-to-house collection in Guestling and Pett, and to get the ball rolling, a Coffee Morning at Paxstead, Pett Road (opp. Pett Recreation Ground) on Saturday May 14th from 10am-12noon, with bring & buy, raffle, and sale of Traidcraft (Christian Aid) goods. Do come if you can, and help to make it a happy social event as well as a successful one.

Have you noticed that our orchid bank by the garage is now officially a Conservation Verge? The verges at Pett end of Rosemary Lane are also now protected, which is especially pleasing as last year we were unable to prevent the orchids there getting their heads cut off.

March was quite an exciting month for 'sightings'. On the 8th. at 10p.m. we saw two tawny owls while driving home along Pannel Lane, then had a lovely view of a very handsome stoat near Pannel Bridge. A week later I was shown a Pipistrelle which had been found dead in a friend's garden. When you see one close up you realise how tiny and delicate these bats are. I also saw my first butterflies of the season - two Small Tortoiseshells - and heard my first Chiff-chaff, so in soite of the inclement weather I feel that Spring has really arrived.

Garlic mustard is now in flower, and the leaves make a tasty addition to salads if you like the taste of garlic. The lanes have been awash with primroses, celandine and wood anemones, and the woods will soon be a sea of bluebells. Aren't we lucky to live in this beautiful area!

"Maybe", said the parrot, "but what can you expect from a Vicar who's named his Bull Terrier 'Heaven', that one that's


