

ROBIN WRITES:

"ITI NWO"

A few years ago the Church focussed on "Children finding faith". The discussion was initiated by the report "Children in the Way", and an attempt was made to investigate why so few seem to make it into adult Christian Church membership. There is a process in a person's development when eventually they have to "OWN" their faith. Being a practising and believing Christian does not depend on others, but finally upon our own PERSONAL COMMITMENT.

I believe the style of churchmanship that has pervaded the Church of England, for maybe hundreds of years, carries the seeds of its own destruction. In the book "Set my people free" written by Ruth Etchells, the Archbishop's Lent book for 1996, she identifies the nub of the problem. "In many of our churches we have a mind-set which sees the clergy as the REAL (ONLY?) FULL-TIME Christians, ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE for the church's continuum."

Nobody is really to blame. Inbred tradition and habit die hard. It cannot easily be replaced. It is not solved by the Rector handing over large scale areas of his work to unprepared, resistant laity. It needs PRAYER AND SENSITIVE CONSULTATION to begin with. If more in our community would OWN the church, as many have done with "conservation" or the "wildlife" (which I loudly applaud!) we would begin to put the Church high on the list of our priorities. If God in some ways nudges you with these words, I would love to hear from you. I would see it as my PRIOR role to help the church THINK DEEPLY about its future!

Firstly, identify with one of the Christian family groups in the Benefice this year. Every six years members of the Church of England have to re-sign their membership on the ELECTORAL ROLL. This has to be completed two weeks before each church Annual Meeting. Simply by getting a form, filling it in and returning it to the relevant officer will be the first step in OWNING your faith as a Christian within the life of the local Church.

Secondly, I challenge you to consider attending the last few sessions of the Diocesan Video "It's Us". I have been surprised by its approach and content. Do come if you can. Start owning your faith this year within your local Church. and community.

I have just been shown a most ingenious birdseed holder made from a plastic bottle. It would take too much space to explain how to make it, but John Osborn will show you if you ask him.

At the beginning of November, when I was recovering from a particularly unpleasant "bug", a friend called to say she had just seen an interesting bird. Ignoring my protests that I should be left to die in peace, she bundled me into her car and whisked me off to Pett Level, where we had excellent views of a Snow Bunting on the beach. We then had to inspect the Ponds, where there was a Barnacle Goose amongst the Canadas, and lots of different waders. By the time my friend brought me home I'd almost forgotten I was supposed to be ill, which just goes to show the therapeutic effects of nature watching!

My peanut holder is attached to the kitchen window frame, so that when one of the larger birds lands on it, it swings against the glass. This makes me look to see who's visiting, and I was delighted recently to see a Great Spotted Woodpecker. I've seen them on other nutbags, but always at a distance, so it was exciting to see one only a few feet away.

Did you notice the Hawthorn on 'Hyde Park' near Faith Cottage? It was covered in flowers and berries at the same time. One of my greenhouse cacti has come into flower, in December would you believe - it normally flowers in May.

I would like to thank everyone for the snippets of news and sightings; I am always interested even if I can't always find room for them in these notes.

"WHAT'S THE CHURCH FOR? "IT IS ... IN ORDER THAT"

'In-order-that' - what? Two PRIMARY AND EQUAL PURPOSES.

ONE dear to all our hearts in the churches, is the coming together in worship of a community of believers who, inspired by the Spirit, share delight in responding to the Christ of the saving story, who has set them free in a joy which bursts out in praise to him and the Father. It is a community held together by that same Holy Spirit in the fellowship which grows from shared worship; a community which seeks to learn (and to share) more and more deeply of the truth and reality and meaning and implications for life today of the Jesus they met in the story and have taken into their hearts so that they know him personally. A community which consequently 'models' the Kingdom of God which, Jesus told his followers, is his very self 'come among you'. This is the inorder-that which so many of us have worked at and given our lives to over the years.

THE OTHER equally important in-order-that is of Christ's own 'great commission' to his followers, prior to his Ascension; 'Go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to the whole Creation'. That is: we the church are called into existence not least so that the world beyond our community may know itself blessed, and take that blessing to itself. 'If the church is the event of people coming together in response to the good news of Jesus, it is also the event of those same people being sent out to carry that good news to others, and invite them to the gathering.' As one writer has it 'The church's being called out of the world sends her into the world; her being sent into the world calls her out of the world.'

Not only are the TWO PURPOSES of the in-order-that church of equal importance; this double calling is equally the task of LAY and ORDAINED CHRISTIANS, who are before God equal members of the faith community and, therefore, EQUALLY ACCOUNTABLE to him in fulfilling their in-order-that nature as church.
