

ROBIN WRITES:

SPRING IN THE AIR

Lent has always been a meaningful time in the life of the Church. The word comes from the Old English "Lenten" which meant "Spring". Early Christians identified the time with the testing of Jesus in the wilderness before His ministry with the power of the Holy Spirit "burst" upon the land of Israel. After what has seemed a long cold winter we all long for the stirrings of Spring and new life.

There have been times in the history of God's Church when all seemed bleak and cold. In those days faithful Christians "fasted and prayed" longing for God to break through in the lives of Christians and those who did not believe to come to living faith. Every Saturday morning at 8.30 am a small group of church members (who actually come from each parish in the Benefice) have met in St Peter's Church to pray with Eileen and I. Sometimes it has been very difficult to make the effort, but God has always been with us. Our prayer has always been for God to visit us again with a spiritual "Springtime".

Even as I write this letter I see in my garden signs of spring flowers beginning to push through the soil. Usually by Mothering Sunday (the fourth Sunday in Lent) daffodils, fullips and crocuses are well established. I have to say I also strain my spiritual eyes to see signs of a spiritual Spring coming. I was greatly warmed by the special open PCC held by Pett Church last month. I was encouraged by the Family Service a few days later, and the support given to both grieving and celebrating families in the village of Pett.

I was also thrilled by the response to the ALPHA TRAINING DAY and the decision made together by representatives from all the parishes to support the launch of Alpha Groups in the Benefice after Easter. One will be held in Fairlight and another in Guestling/Pett starting in April and running for ten weeks. There have been something like 100,000 groups worldwide (80,000 in this country). More news next month.

I encourage all members to attend the Annual Meetings and sense that Spring is in the air.

For currants he is anyones, just as the robin will sell his soul for cheese.

I was very pleased to hear that two barn owls were seen recently in Pannel Lane. When I first came to Pett 20 years ago there were nightly choruses of tawny owls, and I often saw little owls during the daytime. Now all three species seem much more scarce - in fact I haven't seen a little owl for ages. The tawnies disappeared when my horse chestnut was blown down in the hurricane, but I'm glad to say I heard them loud and clear a few days ago in the big beech next door.

Walking through the fields to Pickham Farm I came across the biggest Mole City I've ever seen. What industrious little creatures they are! I know they're not always welcome in gardens, but if you pick up the excavated soil it does come in handy for your summer containers.

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF PETT PCC HELD ON 29 JANUARY IN THE RECTORY

Robin introduced the Bishop's Pastoral Letter "Developing a Pastoral Strategy". Every Deanery in the Episcopal Area had been asked to draw up a strategy. Rye had published its report in 1994 in which the Benefice of Fairlight, Guestling and Pett was discussed, together with the possibility of joining Northiam, Ewhurst and Bodiam. (The latter was not pursued).

The Pastoral Strategy - Robin identified 7 "settlements" in the Benefice eg Fairlight, Fairlight Cove, Pett, Pett Level, Guestling Green, Guestling Thorn and Three Oaks. A "Pastoral Presence" was needed in each place, or at least in each original parish, as the incumbent's role is increasingly administrative. Robin felt "stretched" due to the large area and fragmentation of the work. The meeting agreed and "blamed" the system not the incumbent. The provision of pew cards, with a "Who's Who" was suggested with a delivery to every house in the Benefice.

Worship/Mission - Most of the discussion was on those as yet outside the life of the church. The following suggestions were made:- A review or audit of church life, a visitation and questionnaire, special services which would involve the community. John Taylor suggested showing the Diocesan "It's Us" video in homes, with invitations to friends and neighbours to introduce them to church life. Catherine Hollman was enthusiastic in supporting the arranging of an Alpha Course. Coffee to be served after each service, provided we could get a rota of help. Assistance with the churchyards might release Robin from legalities of management and give him more time for community involvement.

Lay Involvement - The Bishop recommended "Teams" and "Training". Robin explained his attempts to operate teams eg ministry (for worship), administration (wardens and treasurers) and families. A good deal of training has been received. The suggestion was to compile a "time/talent" register, with people taking up specific tasks. Robin would like to extend the network, whereby he knew several people well, and they in turn would influence others, and extend the priest role in the village. He invited the PCC to be his "eyes and ears" in the community and welcomed names to visit or a flow of information. The meeting finished at 9.30 pm.

NB. The Bishop's Letter is to be discussed in the Lent Groups. You would be especially welcome at the Pett venue "Paxstead", Pett Road on Thursdays at 7.30 pm or the Guestling venue "Windswept", Rye Road on Tuesdays at 7.30 pm. We plan a follow up meeting for the whole Benefice after Easter to hear views and opinions.
