It is quite valid so spend time and money on homes, hobbies, sports and other human beings, but when a person becomes converted to Christianity and starts doing the things Jesus commanded, then words like "fanatic" and "extreme" are used.

Why is it so wrong to be "focussed" on Jesus Christ. Paul once said "Every athlete submits to strict discipline in order to be crowned with a wreath that will not last; but we do it for one that will last forever." If you call yourself a Christian may I challenge you to become more "focussed" on your faith. As we approach the GIFT DAY weekend at Pett Church, the Flower Festival at Guestling and the possibilities of new life and vitality in the future, please look at what Jesus Christ means to you. Could you not honestly give more of yourself to Him in the coming months, "To win a prize that will last forever"? His honour and mission need you. "Focus on Him"!

NATURE NOTES

It had been one of those mornings, full of irritations, frustrations and people being awkward, so that I came home from work feeling thoroughly out of sorts. I took my lunch into the garden where I was joined by Blackbird & Son, a couple of sparrows and Robin. A pair of dunnocks were foraging in and out of the hedge bottom, a starling was practising his trimphone impersonations on the roof and a painted lady butterfly was sunning itself on the wall. I could hear sheep baaing and a cuckoo calling, and the air was filled with the delicious perfume of the wild honeysuckle scrambling through the hedge. As my good humour rapidly returned, I thought for the thousandth time how lovely it is to live in the country, surrounded by the sights, sounds and smells of nature.

I counted 253 Spotted Orchids on the bank by the Garage. Perhaps even more pleasing were the seven on the verge in Rosemary Lane, since this verge has only been protected for a couple of years. A neighbour was delighted to find a green-winged orchid in her lawn, where the grass had been left uncut because of naturalised daffodils. If you can bring yourself to leave the first cut a bit later, you might be surprised by what will come in up your lawn!

My blackbird has finally flipped his lid. I saw him tapping on the greenhouse glass and went to investigate. One of his offspring was inside the greenhouse, begging for food, while Blackbird was outside with a beakfull of wrigglies, trying to feed him through the glass. A friend has a blackbird who comes through the back porch and into the kitchen, where he pokes about under the table in the hope of finding crumbs. So far my friend's Tibetan Terrier has not noticed him or perhaps she's "done a Nelson" and failed to see him through her fringe.

We are all used to seeing our gardens laid waste by rabbits, slugs, blackbirds, moles or badgers; but what about the person who found a calf looking in at her back door? Never a dull moment, is there Sue?

THINKING 'BENEFICE'

This first year has been demanding, working out the 'style' of the Benefice of Fairlight, Guestling and Pett. Certain things have emerged so far.

Robin is the Rector, over the whole Benefice, he does not have special responsibility in any part over or against any other. Derek is his part-time assistant throughout the Benefice.

Fairlight makes the greatest demand on both ministers. This year it has been so especially because of the Anniversary year, activities and events. Derek lives in Fairlight and naturally responds to the needs there initially, but has a special interest and concern for Guestling. Robin firstly must respond to church members but with Eileen has always endeavoured to respond to community needs.

Michael Townroe has been very valuable in Pett and Guestling as has Humphrey Newman, always ready to help where needed. Ken Holmes has played a major role in Fairlight and Eileen has worked among the families, women and also worked as a Reader throughout the Benefice.

Without paid assistance, the administration takes a great deal of the Rector's time, with three distinct parishes. Occasional help is appreciated, but much time has to be spent in the study!

The School has been demanding on Robin's time, and he has taken a special interest in the Royal British Legion. With the insistent pressure of funerals, baptisms and weddings, as well as crucial pastoral matters, limited time is left for much else.

The Ministerial Team meets from time to time. Sundays have been covered well, although each church wishes they could see more of the Rector. The quality and variety of the ministry means this Benefice is very fortunate.

The Churchwardens and Treasurers meet to discuss finance and administration. There is an increasing desire to do more together and share resources. A UNITED MEETING of the THREE PCCs is planned for later in the year. The Diocese is pleased with the Rector's FOUR YEAR PLAN and the Revd John Ford (Mission and Renewal) is very supportive.
