HOME AND AWAY

It was a real privilege to have a visit here recently of the DIOCESAN ADVISER for MISSION and RENEWAL, the REVD JOHN FORD. John's role is to help local churches to be outward looking and to make the most of their situation to encourage faith and growth.

You may remember that as a result of the PASTORAL LETTER from Bishop Ian, we studied the programme of developing a PASTORAL STRATEGY. This was first tackled in home groups during Lent, and then a UNITED BENEFICE meeting in April launched the possibility of a FOUR YEAR PLAN for the Benefice. This was supported by each PCC in turn. The first year is to have an APPRAISAL or AUDIT. This actually means LISTENING. John is helping us to think this through.

His ideas are to be shared with the FIRST BENEFICE PCC to be held on 7 November when he will be joining us at St Peter's Church, Fairlight Cove. **AT HOME we are thinking of a FORWARD MOVE.**

This month we shall be entertaining visitors from the CHURCH MISSION SOCIETY. Formerly known as the Church Missionary Society CMS remind us that we belong to a World-wide Church. Revd Laurie and Mrs Wendy Hubbard, just back from leave as MISSION PARTNERS in Damascus, Syria are to be our guests on 27 October. Laurie and Wendy will be speaking at the CMS Hastings & District meeting on Saturday 26 October in the morning and visiting the Bring and Buy Sale at "Beaulieu", Meadow Way in Fairlight from 2.00 - 4.00 pm on the same day. Laurie will preach at Pett on the Sunday at 9.30 am and at Guestling at 11.00 am. The weekend will finish with a United Service at 4.00 pm at St Peter's, Fairlight Cove. There will be retiring offerings at both churches, both for CMS. Please give as generously as you can. The Hubbards will remind us that we have a responsibility towards those abroad as well as at home - **The AWAY is as vital as the HOME.**

NATURE NOTES

I was walking in Guestling Woods with a friend's dog at 8.00 am on a very misty morning. Suddenly Pandora 'spooked' at something up ahead, and following the direction of her gaze I saw a big dark shape in the fork of a tree. A few paces nearer and the shape became a huge cat, so that I thought the Beast of Bodmin must have come on his holidays. Seeing itself observed, the animal stood up, at which point Pandora decided I would handle the situation better without her help. As I walked nearer it seemed to reduce in size, until I was directly underneath it, when it was just a very big domestic or feral cat.

A few days later I saw the biggest Adder I have ever seen - so big that until I got close enough to see the lovely zigzag pattern down its back I thought it must be a grass snake. I tried to measure it against my walking stick, but it didn't take kindly to the interference and got so cross that it wouldn't keep still enough. As its mouth was wide open threatening me, I saw that its tongue was jet black, something I had never previously noticed.

Other interesting sightings include a vixen with two cubs, a hobby chasing swallows near the Royal Oak, and two white rabbits together on Toot Rock. There were eventually more than 350 spotted orchids on the bank by the Garage. There were also a couple of really dark pink yarrow flowers.

A magpie was foraging in a friend's garden when a jay flew down, attacked the magpie and stole its food. I find this surprising, as I would have backed the magpie in a scrap between the two species. They are bigger, heavier birds, even discounting the tail, and give the impression of being much more aggressive.

If you are interested in Nature, why not come along to the meetings of Pett Level Naturalists Society, which are held in the Village Hall on the third Friday of each month. You don't have to be an expert, you will see an interesting slide show, and the annual subscription is only £2.00. Do give it a try - you will be very welcome.

IN MEMORIAM

During the summer we lost several outstanding personalities from our area. Although he had been unwell we were shocked to hear of the death of Archie Beck. Archie was an outstanding character in Guestling for as long as we can remember. Eric Hollingsworth who spoke at the funeral called him the 'Burgermaster of Guestling'. Except for the war years, when he worked on the docks in Portsmouth, Archie was always in and around Guestling. His exploits have become legendary. Eric reminded us of incidents on the cricket field. Archie delighted in colourful language. He was a warm and affectionate friend, but a difficult adversary!

Always committed to Guestling, he was in earlier years around the church, knowing the Evers brothers and was especially close to the Revd Bill Manners. Yet with the loss of the rector of Guestling and the amalgamation of the schools at Guestling, Archie found himself fighting for the old days. The service at St Laurence was a significant occasion, packed with the Guestling community, colleagues from the Parish Council, for which he worked so hard, friends from the Lodge and colleagues from working and leisure days, with a time of remembrance at the reception afterwards.

Our sincere sympathies to sisters Joan and Eileen and niece Alison. Archie's ashes are buried in the grave of his parents in Guestling Churchyard.

We were very sad to lose Elaine Knight, a long time resident of Pett Level and member of Pett Church. She had fought long and hard against her final illness with great faith and courage. Our special prayers are for daughter Dilys and grand-daughter Sam, who will miss her so much. Also to our churchwarden Meriel, who had been such a close friend.

We were also sad to say goodbye to Billy Neal-Morris. His wife Rose had died in March, well in her nineties. Billy found it so hard without her. They had been together for over 50 years, and are now reunited. Billy was buried with Rose in Pett Churchyard. We remember them with affection.

BENEFICE IN BRIEF

The Churches' Magazine Committee met recently to discuss the possibility of a UNITED BENEFICE MAGAZINE! The group consisted of wardens, editors and interested parties. There was a surprising oneness of mind, with a desire to eventually produce a united periodical.

There will be a trial run. A combined DECEMBER/JANUARY edition will be produced under the FAIRLIGHT COVER, as these are already ordered. John is the Diocesan Adviser in Mission and Renewal, a part of a seven strong team appointed to help parishes plan for missionary outreach. John had spent the afternoon with Robin, who showed him round the Benefice. He was very interested in our plans and offered to help us. The Treasurers and Wardens were so impressed with him that he is to visit the FIRST BENEFICE PCC which is to be held on THURSDAY 7 NOVEMBER at St Peter's, Fairlight Cove.

THE LEAGUE OF FRIENDS OF THE MEMORIAL CARE CENTRE, RYE

I would like to thank all those members of the League of Friends and all other local residents and visitors who came to the Garden Party at the Care Centre on 7 September as both helpers and supports. The depth of feeling for the Care Centre was apparent from the numbers who attended; that we raised nearly £2,000 from what was intended to be a fairly low key pleasant occasion says it all. Thank you Rye, Winchelsea and District!

CHRISTMAS CARDS - 8 different Christmas Cards (3 on sale last year and 5 new designs) are on sale at Reception in the Care Centre by the League of Friends. They will also be available at The Charity Card Shop, 11 High Street Rye from 31 October to 17 December, at the AGM and from Tessa Potts, 4 Friars Road, Winchelsea.

The Care Centre comprises a unique blend of community care facilities - 30 sheltered flats for the elderly, a Day Centre, respite care facilities, a community laundry, a kitchen serving the Meals on Wheels service and a Medical Wing consisting of 15 in patient beds and out patient facilities. It is in the Medical Wing that financial problems have arisen. The other facilities are not affected. When, almost a year ago the Charity - Memorial Care Centre, Rye took on the management of the Medical Wing it had to do so in the knowledge that the East Sussex Health Authority (as it then was) were taking up for the National Health Service only 8 of the in patient beds instead of the 12 that had been expected. The Charity was left with the task of raising the resulting revenue shortfall from the remaining 7 beds and from letting facilities in the out patient area. This was a very difficult task and whilst considerable progress has been made in the past 11 months the Charity has not been able to close the gap between the cost of nursing staff and other outgoings on the one hand, and the revenue earned on the other. There is no £200,000 debt outstanding but the point has now been reached where we are simply running out of money.

We are now, therefore, urgently looking for a solution that will ensure the long term continuation of the Medical Wing for the benefit of the people of the Rye area, who contributed so much to the creation of the Centre. During the past year the Hastings & Rother NHS Trust have provided the nursing staff in the Medical Wing under contract to the Charity so they became aware of the difficulty that was being experienced. Now, together with the East Sussex, Brighton and Hove Health Authority they have joined us, with their enormous experience in health care, in helping to find a solution that will secure the Medical Wing on a long term basis. Both they and we believe that there are exciting possibilities for developing the facilities here at the memorial Care Centre. Rye Health and Care Ltd the original Charity that still owns the property are determined that the Medical Wing shall be preserved and we are all working towards a successful outcome.
