

ROBIN WRITES:

BAD NEWS or IS IT?

As I write this letter news has come about the further decline in attendance at CHURCH OF ENGLAND churches, at 3% in 1995 the biggest for 20 years. 100,000 less attend now compared with 1990. Statistics are notoriously difficult to interpret. One claim is that just as many attend but they come less frequently and this is reflected in the overall figures. Pressures on family life continue. At weekends people visit relatives who now live at some distance. It is noticeable that the greatest decline is among the young. In 1995 nearly 5% of under 16 year olds stopped going to church. All of this is BAD NEWS. It would be foolish to bury our heads in the sand, or even look for "scapegoats"! Our Benefice has embarked on an APPRAISAL and maybe we shall discover the reason why people have stopped attending church. Could I make some suggestions?

Lack of Faith. In our so-called Christian Country, fewer people actually believe in the faith of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and His Church. This starts in our homes and continues. There is little appetite to learn the Faith and study it. There is little teaching of Jesus and his way. A lack of knowledge and conviction lead to agnosticism and finally atheism.

Lack of Loyalty. I know some parents who ring the married children every day and see them at weekends! Many people think that once a month at Church or less is sufficient to maintain their relationship with their Heavenly Father. When inquirers or visitors come to Church and find the regular members absent it does not breed confidence!

Lack of Enthusiasm. There seems to be an aversion to religious fervour in this generation. It is all right to be keen on a sport. We can be "over the moon" about conservation, birds, animals and plants. We can worship our gardens and our cars, but when somebody discovers faith in Jesus and wants to express it, he or she is a fanatic. No wonder few attend it it is only a matter of a duty and rote!

However, there is plenty of GOOD NEWS. First the Gospei of Jesus Christ remains the same, regardless of a lack of faith, loyally and zeal. Secondly, although a UNITED BENEFICE, overall numbers have not declined! More than 50 people have attended ALPHA courses in the past year, and there is sufficient support for a planned programme to make the Church more accessible and relevant to those who live in our villages. I invite you to give Church a chance, respond to our questionnaires and visit us.

7 NATURE NOTES

Have you seen the new white calf at Lunsford Farm? He is pure white, not albino, and is the first to be born on the farm for many years. I gather he is already quite a character.

Somewhere near Bower Cottage there lives a rather cultured robin. He has been nipping in an open window and taking pot pourri from a bowl on the window sill, presumably to line his nest. A nestful of scented baby robins - what a lovely thought.

During the very cold weather a group of long-tailed tits were coming to the bird feeders. According to the RSPB these delightful little pink, black and white birds are becoming much more frequent visitors to gardens, mainly because people now offer good quality food rather than just stale bread.

Looking out of the kitchen window I saw a mob of sparrows attacking something on the ground. It turned out to be a dead vole. I have frequently noticed that birds are afraid of voles, shrews and mice, and will not approach the food if any small mammal is present, so presumably the chance to "get their own back" on a dead one was too good to miss.

My favourite shrub is now in full bloom, shining golden amidst fog, frost and rain, sweetly scented, hardy, doesn't need pruning, nothing eats it, and at its best when the weather is t its worst. I wouldn't be without a witch hazel. If you walk along the footpath between the Sawyers Field and Watermill Lane, you can see a really big one in the garden of Watermill House.

LISTENING YEAR - UNDER WAY!

We were very thrilled with REVD JOHN FORD's visit to us in January to launch the LISTENING YEAR. John managed to speak at the three Parish Churches on the morning of 19 January - which was quite a feat! He also managed to apply the same message in a different way to each church. We were very impressed with his talk to the children at the Family Communion at Guestling. We all learnt a lot and found it very interesting. The overall message was that we needed to be committed to Christ, and to be in co-operation with each other in the Benefice.

Nearly 60 attended the BENEFICE LUNCH at Guestling/Bradshaw School. He told us of the DIOCESAN DAYS on Mission and Renewal at Worth Abbey near Crawley on 25/26 April, when the officer for the Decade of Evangelism, Canon Robert Warren, will be the main speaker. A number from the three Churches have signed up to attend. There are details in the Churches for any who wish to join them on the Friday or Saturday.

On the Sunday afternoon about 20 people in all from the Churches met John to talk about the APPRAISAL. This involved responding to TWO DIFFERENT QUESTIONNAIRES. First for church members - finding out where they attend and why, and discovering ways to make their worship better for them. The second is for members of the community, to help us assess our role in the neighbourhood and how we are viewed. We do hope that you will encourage your friends and neighbours to take part.

The Appraisal will be conducted separately in each parish, then the representatives will meet together, as a Benefice, to exchange ideas and compare results. During LENT about 60 members in 6 groups will be studying and exploring "LISTENING PRAYER". On 7 June we have booked a part of the OAST HOUSES CONFERENCE CENTRE in Ewhurst Green for a QUIET DAY, led by our friend JOHN GOODING from CPAS who visited us, with much profit, two years ago. Another friend, SHEILA SHEPHEARD, will be assisting him.

We are also hoping to arrange for a coach to take us to ARDINGLY on 21 June for CARITAS. This will be a real spur to our faith. Please book the date in your diary and come with us!

PETT PARISH PUMP

The Annual Parish Assembly will be held in Pett Village Hall at 7.30 pm on Tuesday 25 March, following a brief Meeting of the Parish Council. This is your chance to come along and make known any matters of concern within the Parish. If there is something you think should be discussed but you are unable to attend the Assembly, you can put your concerns in writing to the Clerk at Rectory Cottage, and your letter will be read out and discussed:

Each year the Parish Council invites someone to the Assembly to talk about a matter of local interest. This year the subject will be Traffic Calming Measures. I am unable to give you the speaker's name at present as details have not yet been finalised. This should be a very interesting talk, and if you are at all concerned about the speed of traffic through the Village you will probably find it well worthwhile to attend.
