

"NEW" (NEW TESTAMENT) CHURCH

All this year we are having an appraisal of our churches in this Benefice. We have managed to gain help from the Diocesan Adviser in Renewal and Mission, JOHN FORD. We are fortunate to have in Pett, CANON MICHAEL TOWNROE, who has been a major force in the church in Sussex for more than 50 years. Although only just over half way through the exercise, certain things are beginning to emerge for us.

A NATIONAL INITIATIVE

Michael pointed out to the Pett PCC that we are undertaking a programme which is happening through the national Church. The appointment of John Ford by our Diocesan Bishop matches every diocese at this time. The drastic decline in clergy was precipitated by a lack of funds, but has led us to look again at the first principles of our Church Life. As Michael told us our discoveries have forced us back to the FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH that we read about in the NEW TESTAMENT. Many are frightened of change, but many of the changes taking place put us back into New Testament days. As we approach the THIRD millennium, we are starting again at the beginning of the FIRST!

A CHANGE FROM PRIEST TO PRIESTHOOD

We have evolved (up to some 40 years ago) a practice that each village would have its own "priest" who had the "cure" of all the souls. To maintain that approach we would need THREE TIMES as many clergy as we have today (and the numbers are declining). Throughout the whole Church there is a realisation that the work undertaken by ONE should now be shared by the "PRIESTHOOD OF ALL BELIEVERS". The role of the Vicar or Rector should change from being a "front-line" man to role of a "leader" or "manager" of a company. This is the teaching of the New Testament which knew nothing of vicars or rectors. The individual vicar will have his own style depending upon his ability, personality and training. Together the whole church will provide all that is necessary for the Church to continue.

TRAINING THOSE WILLING

Canon Michael writes elsewhere in the Parish News about a series of meetings to train and equip members of the Church who would like to understand their faith better and be a part of the NEW (NEW TESTAMENT) CHURCH. We will be only too happy to tell you more about it.

11 NATURE NOTES

On 15 June I saw a White Admiral in Guestling Woods. This is the first one I have seen for several years. If you are a member of the Sussex Wildlife Trust you will know what a White Admiral looks like, as it is the Trust's emblem.

I have been given a newspaper cutting about Lyme Disease, which is potentially fatal. It is carried by ticks, and cases have occurred in this area. If you spend time in areas where bracken or long grass is widespread, you are advised to "wear long-sleeved tops and trousers tucked into boots". Having said all that, there were only 300 cases reported in the whole country last year, so you are probably more likely to get killed crossing Pett Road. As with all potential dangers it is sensible to be aware, but don't let's get it out of proportion.

Back to more cheerful thiings:- some of the birds have had a wonderful season, and my garden is awash with baby blue tits, great tits, dunnocks, sparrows, thrushes and starlings. All except the thrushes and dunnocks have been learning to use the peanut feeder, with much fluttering of wings and unscheduled free-falls. The tits predictably learned fast. The baby sparrows are really comical, their little wings going like windmills till they give up and perch on the well handle waiting for handouts from their harrassed parents. They are great time-wasters!

Although I've seen adult spotted flycatchers, I haven't seen any young ones, and for the third year running I've had no martins. I particularly miss the martins as they used to wake me at the crack of dawn with their lovely gentle chunterings.

"LISTENING YEAR" - Response to Questionnaires -

In July the Pett PCC met to consider the response to questionnaires delivered to each house in Pett. A representative from Fairlight and Guestling (who are also conducting similar surveys) was welcomed to the meeting, which adopted a positive attitude to a report incorporating the recorded thoughts and feelings of people towards and about the Church. This report maintains the confidentiality of the identity of those who returned completed questionnaires.

As Canon Michael Townroe reminded us, the Church is not just buildings but "The Blessed Company of all Faithful People". With this in mind the PCC began to examine ways in which the Church can possibly enhance its role in the parish and the United Benefice. The report highlighted some very positive suggestions that need to be prayerfully and carefully examined together with an appraisal of the resources available (in terms of "people") to bring some of these ideas to fruition. In the meantime, please bear with the PCC, guided by Robin and his staff. Your responses to the questionnaire were welcomed and

much appreciated, and all will be carefully considered. As the report states: "The mission of the Church is ongoing and regardless of age we can all do our part. By listening to each other and listening to God, we can perhaps begin to make changes on the basis of what we have learnt".

It meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month, from 2.00 pm to 4.00 pm at the Community Centre, Winchelsea Beach and is managed by a Co-ordinator and a group of volunteers. It is very friendly and covers a wide area including Rye, Rye Harbour, Winchelsea, Fairlight, Beckley, Brede and Three Oaks. Transport is arranged to collect and return members. There are also similar clubs at Battle and Bexhill. Through the ESAB the Club is able to provide the following services:

- (a) Aids to assist the visually impaired including talking clocks, watches, games, writing equipment, radios and much more.
- (b) A Home Visiting Scheme which ensures that the visually impaired living in remote rural areas or those with multiple handicaps with little or no contact with the outside world are not isolated and cut off. The support will vary according to the needs, but may include reading, dealing with the mail, visits to the shops and assistance in claiming benefits.
- (c) An Audio Cassette Lending Library. There are several hundred titles in stock including a Video Library for the visually impaired.
- (d) Information concerning the British Wireless for the Blind.
- (e) Holidays. Two residential, escorted holidays are organised each year.
- (f) A quarterly newsletter called "Harmony House" which is full of interesting news, information, profiles and articles. This is available either in large print or on tape.
- (g) Grant aid, in exceptional circumstances which is administered by a special committee.

Volunteers are vital to enable the Club to provide services to the visually impaired. New volunteers are always needed particularly those who are willing to use their cars to collect and return our members to and from the Club for which expenses are paid. If you know of someone in the community who would benefit from being a member of the Club, or if you would like to be a Home Visitor or can give just one afternoon a month to assisting those who cannot see or who are visually impaired, then please contact the Co-ordinator, Ken Gill, on 01424 812293.
