8 NATURE NOTES

A number of people have commented on my tribute to Sue in the October magazine, and have asked who wrote the poem. I'm sorry I don't know - does anyone else? It was sent to me by a friend after I lost my beloved Anna, and clearly I'm not the only one to find it very moving.

Sharon Harden, who lives at Hill House, Chick Hill, acts as a 'rehomer' of hedgehogs for Mallydams. She keeps them in her garden for a while before letting them go. Sharon would like to be informed of any hedgehog sightings in the area.

A tawny owl was found shot in Watermill Lane a few weeks ago. This is not only tragic, it is also illegal, and if anyone has any information about the gunman they should report it to the police.

If you leave your windfall apples where they lie, or put out over-ripe fruit, you may well attract Fieldfares and redwings. In the days before I knew what Redwings were I used to call them "Badger Birds" because of their prominent white eye stripes. When I was given a Bird Book for Christmas, I also discovered that my Tortoiseshell Finches were Bramblings, and my Mouse Birds were Dunnocks, amongst others.

While having tea with a friend in Rectory Park recently, a Kestrel landed on her patio and paused long enough for us to get a good view before flying away.

Another magic moment happened while I was dog-sitting for a friend at Westfield. I saw the dogs standing in a circle at the end of the large garden, and went to investigate. In the middle of the circle was a toad, inflated to bursting point and slowly pivoting to show his fearsome self to each of the six curious canine faces. (What you might call a toad in a bit of a hole) When I called the dogs away he withdrew in a very dignified manner into the undergrowth. I bet when he got back to Toad Hall he told Ratty and Mole that he'd defeated a whole pack of wolves single-handed!

It would be helpful if all users of the Recreation Ground would keep an eye on the play area. The roundabout should be repaired by the time you read this, and the new seat (theoretically vandal proof) should be installed.

Still on the subject of the Recreation Ground, there have been one or two piles of dog faeces left there lately. Anyone's dog, no matter how well-trained, can get "taken short", and no harm is done if the owner picks up after it. You can buy proper Poop Scoops at Pet Shops, but a plastic bag is equally effective. There has also been a lot of litter left lying about; Tim Jury picked up a large sackful recently. Please help to keep our lovely Recreation Ground clean for everyone's enjoyment.

Several people have expressed concern about the use of Chick Hill by the school buses. As the Hill is a public highway, there is nothing the Parish Council can do to prevent its lawful use by the bus company. ESCC Highways Department has been asked to ensure that the Hill is thoroughly gritted in the event of icy weather.
