Everything is recycled. Two are made from an old copper cylinder (not popular with snails). Edges trimmed with old hose pipe. Middle one is a large fishing box found on the beach at Pett Level. The base frame is all from wood scraps and raised to a great height. Weed suppressant is an off cut of floor covering. Best match to grass. I have to confess not all my own work except the planting so far, and painting on the wood preservative. Last year's rescued plants to be added tomorrow.






