



This is a queen common carder bumblebee feeding on comfrey. Comfrey is a great plant for bumblebees as it has a relatively long flowering season. It is also useful for gardeners because you can make comfrey tea from the leaves. But before you rush for the kettle, comfrey tea is a very good tomato fertilizer.

My recipe - fill a tub with comfrey leaves, fill the tub with water and put a lid on. Go back 3 or 4 weeks later and hold your nose when you take the lid off as it will smell disgusting. Strain the liquid and dilute before feeding your plants.






