

Following on from my initial email to you regarding the upcoming works on Battery Hill and Fairlight Road, please find some more detailed information about this work below.

Breakdown of the works included:

- Drainage works - daytime working from 24th August –11th September.
- Carriageway support works - daytime working from 14th to 30th September
- Vegetation clearance - daytime working from 1st to 3rd October.
- Resurfacing, ironwork, speed humps and high friction surfacing - day and night working from 5th -23rd October.
- Continuation of High Friction surface applications and new road markings - day and night works from 23rd -30th October.

Bus services and access for residents of the road:

Bus services through Beacon Road will be maintained throughout and the works in this area will be carried out at night to enable this. A shuttle bus will be provided to substitute the 101 service through Fairlight Road and Battery Hill.

We have allocated phasing to enable residential and business access to be maintained. There will be designated gateman on site who will be able to assist residents each day on how best to egress and access their property.

Road closure details:

Full road closures are required for safety purposes to carry out extensive excavations across the carriageway, due to the nature of these works, and the width of the road traffic lights are not possible.

Given the disruption closing this sensitive location generates, we are utilising this period to carry out extensive repairs through multiple disciplines with a view to eradicating the need for further disruptive visits in the future.

Diversion route:

The main diversion utilises the A259 to enable HGV movements.

Traffic will be diverted via Pett Level Road, Chick Hill, Pett Road, A259 and vice versa.

A separate diversion for HGVs will be signed via Pett Level Road, Sea Road, A259 Tanyard Lane, A259 Icklesham, A259 Guestling, A259 Rye Road and vice versa.

We will be installing "SLOW" and "ACCESS ONLY" signage throughout built up areas to ensure any local traffic using these roads do so with appropriately.
