### Police tackle knife crime in East Sussex with days of action

Sussex Police is tackling knife crime in East Sussex with increased proactive patrols, searches and knife sweeps as part of a number of days of action in Eastbourne, Rother, Wealden and Hastings.

The activities use funding secured from the Home Office dedicated to combating serious violence across Sussex.

During a weekend of action in Hastings, four arrests were made and seven weapons seized.

# Hastings and Rother policing teams combatting antisocial/dangerous driving and motorcycle riding

Last Friday, speed checks were conducted on the following roads: Crowhurst Road (St Leonards), Harley Shute Road (St Leonards), A259 New Road (Rye), and Cooden Drive (Bexhill).

16 Traffic Offence Reports were issued: 14 for excess speed, 1 for a number plate offence, and 1 for driving without due care. 9 verbal warnings were also given.

In addition, 2 motorcyclists received Fixed Penalty Notices for having excessively loud exhausts.

Officers will be continuing their work to combat these issues, and encourage the public to continue to report dangerous driving/riding with as many details as possible so that they can catch the culprits and keep the roads safe.




### Warning after reports of scam emails in Sussex

Police are warning people to be wary of fraudulent emails purporting to be from HM Courts and Tribunals after receiving five reports of scams in Sussex.

The emails state that the victims owe a £25 fixed penalty charge. They say that if the victim does not pay the fine they will face greater charges of £100 and detail methods of payment.

Fortunately, no victims have reported losing any money.

### Ongoing police activity to reduce road casualties

Police are continuing to provide education and enforcement as part of a weeklong operation aimed reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured on our roads.

Surrey Police and Sussex Police are among the forces supporting Project EDWARD – Every Day Without A Road Death – this week, through activity including speed and noise detection, and antisocial driving and riding.


Specialist roads policing officers, supported by divisional units, have carried out dedicated patrols across the counties from Monday 14 September, with a focus on the 'fatal five' offences.

These include speeding, drink and drug-driving, mobile phone use, not wearing a seatbelt and inconsiderate driving.

Officers have also listened to and engaged with communities where particular concerns have been expressed.

All of this is in addition to our routine roads policing, 365 days a year.
