# Rural crime team warning to walkers: Please do not damage stock fencing

Rural Crime Team PCSO Julie Pearce-Martin has joined forces with local farmers and Battle Town Council to highlight the problem of walkers damaging stock fencing.

Farmer John Wheatland says his fences behind the Battle Abbey area have been deliberately cut. He said: "It is a constant worry for me. My cows and calves get out onto public land and I have to get there as quickly as possible to get them back onto my land."

#### St Leonards stabbing: Police appeal for witnesses

Police are appealing for witnesses after a man was stabbed in Grand Parade, St Leonards, on Monday (26 October) at about 3.15pm.

The incident occurred near the Grand Hotel. The 38-year-old victim was taken to hospital for treatment and is in a stable condition. A 44-year-old man was arrested shortly after the incident on suspicion of grievous bodily harm and remains in custody.

Anderson is also wanted for questioning in relation to further offences allegedly committed whilst evading custody.



#### **Roads Activity**

At the end of September, our activity on one Friday evening resulted in multiple ticket offence reports for speeding and two vehicles being seized. In addition to this a speed camera caught ten speeding motorists on Coombe Valley Way and St Helens Road in Hastings.

On Wednesday 7 October our PCSOs were placing 'slow down 30mph' signs out around Rother and Bexhill to remind drivers of the 30mph limit. This was shared on the local district social media and was seen 2410 followers.

We're strengthening our links with Community Speedwatch following meetings with the Rother Association of Local Councils by appointing a nominated police point of contact for the Community Speedwatch volunteers to share their data. The data will assist informing targeted police activity in the area. This enables the most at risk locations in Rother to be identified and we're working with partners from East Sussex County Council, Rother District Council and Highways to explore further road safety options. The Rother Neighbourhood

Policing Team (formally known as the Prevention team) inspector is looking to support the Rother Association of Local Councils in obtaining a Black Cat speed tracking device.

On Sunday 11 October in response to complaints of speeding vehicles from residents in the Cooden Drive area, officers went there and issued five speeding tickets.

In one evening on Thursday 8 October 15 vehicles were stopped resulting in the discovery of a raft of offences that included one person arrested for driving over the specified drug limit, tickets were issued for a defective exhaust and no insurance and two warnings were given out for anti-social behaviour whilst driving. These were dealt with under Section 59 and if a second warning is received their vehicles can be seized.



Action Fraud scam watch

Did you know scams cost the UK economy £5-£10 Billion a year, with over 50% of people over 65 having already been targeted by scams; and only 5% of all scams reported?

This week's scam and fraud warnings from Action Fraud:

 We are aware of scammers claiming to be from HMRC offering financial support as a result of coronavirus. If you receive a text, email or call claiming to be from HMRC that asks you to click on a link or give info such as your name, credit card or bank details, it's a scam.



 Criminals will build your trust over a number of weeks or months but are they really who they say they are? Could they be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore requests for your financial or personal details.
