My eye was caught by an old libretto of "The Yeoman of the Guard" There was a bookseller's label from a shop in Rangoon. A name inside the front cover was "H G Nicolson", and on looking him up I found that he was a member of the Rangoon Gymkhana Club and had played cricket for Burma against the MCC. It had travelled a log way!

Editor's Note: I came across the following courtesy of Wikipedia which I accept is no guarantee of accuracy. It is fascinating how the echoes from the past remain with us. I wonder if there is any local connection?

"H.G. Nicolson (dates of birth and death unknown) was a Burmese cricketer, although where he was born is unknown. It is also unknown what Nicolson's batting and bowling styles were. Nicolson made his first-class debut for Rangoon Gymkhana in their only first-class match, which came against the Marylebone Cricket Club in February 1927. In this match he scored 32 runs in the Gymkhana's first-innings, before being dismissed by Maurice Tate, while in their second-innings he scored 37 runs before being dismissed by Bob Wyatt. Nicolson also kept wicket in the match. Two days after the conclusion of that match, Nicolson made his second and final first-class appearance for Burma against the MCC. He was dismissed for a duck in Burma's first-innings by Maurice Tate and in their second-innings he was dismissed for 2 by the same bowler."

PROVISION OF CARDIOLOGY AND OPTHAMOLOGY IN EAST SUSSEX

A reader has asked that we highlight a public consultation, the results of which may impact the way in which we receive the above services, and notes that although there have been many respondents to this consultation, few of them have been from our area.

For cardiology, clinicians want to create new cardiac response teams at the emergency departments (EDs) at Conquest Hospital and Eastbourne District General Hospital, and to concentrate the most highly specialised cardiac services at one or other of the hospital sites.

For ophthalmology, clinicians want to consolidate the services currently provided at Bexhill Hospital, Conquest Hospital and Eastbourne District General Hospital, into two sites at Bexhill Hospital and Eastbourne District General Hospital. This would enable patients to have quicker access to tests and treatment and more input from the most senior clinicians. It would also enable one-stop clinics, reducing the number of appointments patients need to attend.





Back in the Spring of 2019, when we began this community archive project for Fairlight, Guestling and Pett, no one foresaw the pandemic, so we didn't expect that getting to this stage would take the best part of three years. Now, finally, we have a home for the archive, secure, wired, equipped, and furnished and we are planning for digital cataloguing of our collections to commence in the first half of 2022. We are holding an Open Day at Pett Methodist Church on February 12th, so you can see for yourself.

On the day, the Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex, Andrew Blackman, will formally declare the ARC room open at 11:30am. In the main hall, we will be exhibiting a collection of original artwork from significant 20th century artists with links to this area. Haydon Luke will be giving an extended talk about this subject, at 12 noon and 2pm. We're sure that some of the names will surprise you! As well as the exhibition and the talks, there will be refreshments and a chance to talk to committee members about future plans and to see the ARC room. Entry is FREE but you will be encouraged to support us by becoming (or renewing as) a Friend of the ARC under a new, annual scheme. The cost of running the ARC is modest, but it doesn't pay for itself!

Getting to this point has required money and dedicated time, so the Open Day is also an opportunity to thank all those who've helped us make it this far: Rother District Council and our ward councillors, Roger Bird and Andrew Mier; The Isabel Blackman Foundation; Fairlight, Guestling and Pett Parish Councils; and the many individuals from across the area who have made donations, large and small, to our Friends' fund or who have donated equipment or their time.

We look forward to welcoming you on the day and if, when you have seen what is planned, you would like to get more involved in the project just have a word with one of the Committee members. Please note: masks may still be required on the day

PETT LEVEL PRESERVATION TRUST

Here we are in February 2022, the shortest month and for me the last time I write as Chair of the Pett Level Preservation Trust although I will remain as a Trustee and look forward to contributing in other ways. We are still inviting new Trustees so please consider this as an opportunity for you to get involved.

At our December meeting we decided that the role of Chairperson should rotate every 4 years, a decision I supported whole heartedly. GARDENING CLUB NOTES

It was a pleasure to be able to hold our first meeting of the New Year, masks and lateral flow tests notwithstanding!

Our speaker, Colin Page, a local amateur photographer, gave us a delightful and informative insight into the natural

landscape we are so fortunate to have all around us. Colin worked for many years at Harborough Nurseries and describes himself as a plantsman, photographer, and naturalist. He is not professionally trained in photography but has been a member of the Rye Camera Club for many years, having first become interested on inheriting his grandfather's camera as a youngster.

His talk, entitled "In Winter's Light", illustrated many aspects of nature in autumn and winter, Colin's favourite time of year. The focus was on capturing with his camera the play of light on his chosen subjects - he explained that light is the most important facet of photography. We were treated to many exquisite photos of birds, trees, landscapes, beaches, marshes, plants and gardens, all taken during the winter months. Colin walks the local routes around Rye, Pett Level, Winchelsea and Brede, throughout the year, often photographing the same scenes in different seasons, capturing along the way the local wildlife scene in general and wonderful shots of resident, visiting and rare, birds. He showed a lovely close-up of a black headed gull minus its black head, since it turns white in winter - who knew! There was another amazing picture of waxwings feasting on snow-covered cotoneaster berries - the dead of winter, but so colourful. Colin ably demonstrated that winter is far from dull. When the sun is out it can create such wonderful effects on the landscape, throwing the simplest things into relief - fox paw marks glowing in the otherwise shadowy snow - huge trees, with no leaves to muddy the spectacle, their trunks glowing with golden and reddish tones and patterns. One stunning shot of acer trees in autumn, their leaves afire with intense reds and yellows, was particularly memorable. Snowy and frosty scenes featured with winter flowering plants and shrubs, daphne, sarcococca, cherry, peeping out through the snow and thick frost shining crystalline on bracken and grasses, creating a textured white carpet.

Colin may say he is an amateur, but his photos demonstrated experience gained over many years alongside a keen eye for colour and composition, an obvious love of the natural world and great skill and delicacy of touch - his talents combining to provide all present with an inspiring and uplifting evening, all the more welcome, being so far removed from these difficult times.

Our next meeting will be on **Tuesday 8th February at 7.30 p.m**. in the Catherine Holman Room at Pett Village Hall. Ann Novotny and David Penfold will deliver a talk entitled "Discovering the World of the Iris." Annual subscriptions will also be due -£10 for the coming year - new members most welcome. There will also be a Seed Swap, a new venture to help kick-start the growing year ahead - please bring along any surplus seeds, whether commercial or gathered. Details will be emailed to existing members nearer the time.


Learning at Guestling Bradshaw

They send out tens of thousands of items a year, giving to a diverse range of services, such as refugee centres, homeless shelters, and hospitals. At the moment they are in need of blankets (in larger sizes), Peacie on tiers show hildren and adults, and scarves, gloves and socks in all sizes.

Our Pett on the Knit project is to knit squares for the blankets, which are then admagrocheted togethers. The dimensions and pattern for the squares are repeated below. Squares should measure 12.5cms (5 inches) square, be made of synthetic DK wool, and its delivery of warm knitting worldwide knifted on No 4mm (old fashioned No 8) needles.

PETT PARISH COUNCIL REPORT - CLLR DAVID PENFOLD

The council met in January and welcomed Richard Smith to his first meeting. Probably, the most important decision made was to agree the budget for 2022-23 and to keep the precept the same as in the current year. Unfortunately, this does not mean that your overall council tax will not increase as the county is having to put more money into roads maintenance and adult social care.

With reference to roads, I am pleased to say that the road surface just outside the Pett Level gateway, which has been getting more dangerous by the day, will shortly be patched and the potholes in the rest of the road to Winchelsea Beach will be filled at the same time. The road will have to be closed while the work is done. My thanks to all whose efforts have led to this outcome. The council also discussed the '20's Plenty' initiative, which aims to reduce speed limits to 20 mph over a wide area but felt that a 20 mph limit would be disregarded and the initiative was ahead of its time as it is difficult to get many motorists to obey the 30 mph signs. The council agreed to revisit the proposal at a meeting in the future.


Other decisions made at the meeting were: to make a grant to the playgroup Little Ducklings by contributing to the cost of hiring the village hall (Councillors were unanimous in their support for this venture and hoped to see it grow and establish itself on a formal basis); to erect a footpath map, and possibly plant a tree, to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee (an application will be made to Rother District Council for matched funding); and to agree a Memorandum of Understanding with the Archive Resource Centre (ARC), on the basis of which back issues of the parish news (which the council is obliged to keep) will be stored at ARC so that they can be used for research.

Councillor Andrew Mier reported that two Afghan families have been housed in the district. If you are able to help, Rother has a more general tenant finding scheme (see www.rother.gov.uk/housing/rother-tenant-finder-scheme-incentive/). Councillor Mier also reported that the Rother planning process is getting back on track and applications are being processed more quickly. In addition, the pre-application service has resumed from the beginning of January and a new approach is being taken to enforcement in order to deal with the long list of outstanding cases.

I also attended a recent meeting of Rother Association of Local Councils. Various district council initiatives were reported there: consideration is being given to installing electric car charging points in car parks; and discussions are ongoing on how to implement the provisions of the latest environment act, which requires councils to collect both garden waste and food waste without any charge to the householder (it is not yet clear when this will be implemented). There are also still grants available to businesses affected by Covid that have not so far received a grant.

Finally, in spite of representations from all levels of local government, the government has decided not to change the law covering how councils meet. Many councils wanted to be able to determine for themselves whether to meet in person or remotely over the Internet - or even hold hybrid meetings - but the government has decided that face-to-face meetings must continue (which means face masks and open windows).

NATURE NOTES FROM NORFOLK

As I write this we are spending a few days with family up in Norfolk. Even though it is winter, there is still plenty going on in the natural world and we have been treated to some of nature's finest spectacles. One of these was the sight of large skeins of pink-footed geese several hundred strong (Norfolk Wildlife Trust at Cley estimated there to be around 1,000 birds altogether) forming some amazing murmurations as they wheeled around looking for a suitable site to roost for the night. Pink-footed geese breed in Greenland and Iceland and migrate to the UK for our milder winters. They tend to favour coastal sites and we have seen them before near Southport on the North-West coast, but Norfolk has a particular attraction for them - sugar beet. At this time of year, the sugar beet is dug up and the tops are cut off and discarded onto the fields. The pink footed geese find the juicy tops irresistible.

The other wildlife spectacle of note was the sight of grey seal pups hauled out on the beach at Winterton. These cute and fluffy and mostly white animals weigh about 14 kg and are born late in the year. (Their fur gets darker as they age.) They stay on the beach or in the dunes and are then suckled by their mothers for about three weeks, gaining around 40 kg in the



process, more than tripling their birth weight. Their mother's milk is particularly nutritious and is necessary to build the thick layer of blubber needed to insulate them from the cold North Sea. We only saw a couple of adults as they spend most of their time out at sea fishing. Sadly, we also saw several pup corpses. Whether these were still-born or too weak to survive the weather or predated in some way is not clear, but we did see many more fat and healthy pups and I understand that the UK grey seal population is on the increase. Incidentally, the scientific name of the grey seal Halichoerus grypus, gives a clue as to how to distinguish the grey seal from the common seal. It means hook-nosed sea-pig.

Further inland, we visited Foxley Wood, one of Norfolk's most ancient woodlands. Though planted with non-native conifers in the 1960's, these have now been cleared and the woods allowed to regenerate naturally which has resulted in a healthy mix of old broad-leaved trees, coppice and new saplings. Many of the older trees contained witches' brooms. These have nothing to do with old women in pointy hats nor with sweeping the floor, but they are a type of gall that produces a tangled twiggy mass that almost resembles a bird's nest. The galls can affect many different trees especially deciduous trees and can be caused by viruses, bacteria, insects, or fungus. The most common ones affect birch trees and are caused by a particular fungus called Taphrina betulina, the scientific name indicates that it affects Betula species, that is, either of our common native birches Betula pendula, the Silver Birch, or Betula pubescens, the Downy Birch. Should you wish to decide which birch you are looking at, the Silver Birch has smooth twigs, and the Downy Birch has hairy (pubescent) twigs. However, don't be too confident with your identification because the two species readily hybridize with each other and exhibit varying degrees of hairiness.

SEXTON BEETLES: SUBTERRANEAN CORPSE-DISPOSAL BLUES BY MICHAEL BLENCOWE OF THE SUSSEX WILDLIFE TRUST

"Now, you got a corpse in a car, minus a head...take me to it." In Quentin Tarantino's movie Pulp Fiction, Winston Wolf provides a professional clean-up service for two incompetent hitmen when they have a little 'problem' that needs solving urgently. Hopefully, illicit corpse disposal isn't a regular dilemma for readers of this magazine but in the natural world death, disposal, decay and decomposition are vital, constant processes which recycle the nutrients that keep our planet functioning. This clean-up duty is undertaken by a cast of unsung underworld characters. Bacteria and blow-flies, fungi and foxes, worms and woodlice all put their tendrils, talons, mandibles and molars to the task. But if you want a corpse removed efficiently and cleanly you had better call in the professionals: the sexton beetles.

The sextons are members of the family Silphidae. At about 3cm long they are amongst the heavyweights of our county's 3,000 beetle species. Some sextons can be identified by their lurid orange wing-cases; a hi-vis jacket befitting a worker at the scene of a tragedy. Now, let's say you've got a dead blue tit in the back yard. Its little soul will have winged its way to that great peanut



feeder in the sky and now it's time to return its earthly body back to the soil. Sextons, armed with super-sensitive chemoreceptors in their clubbed antennae, can detect the sweet smell of death from a mile away.

The male flies in first and assesses the scene. First job - call for backup. He secretes a stink from his rear end to lure in a female and his partner arrives. Next job - secure the corpse. The beetles start beetling around the blue tit, stripping off the feathers. But - phew-wee! That smell will soon be luring in every fly in the neighbourhood and the sextons don't want to draw attention to their work. So, they baste the body with their antibacterial and antifungal chemicals, slowing down the decay and preventing the pong. Now the sextons live up to their name. Working together, they dig a grave and line it with feathers. The corpse is tenderly lowered down into the earth. It's here, in this cosy crypt, that the sextons will raise their family. Eggs are laid and develop into hungry larvae which, unusually for an insect, 'beg' for food and are fed by their devoted parents. The bird's body is slowly stripped of flesh and reduced to a simple skeleton. After pupation, new sexton beetles emerge from the soil and fly away, perhaps to find their own corpse or to become food for birds themselves. No eulogy, no flowers, yet it's still a dignified, life-affirming send off. So, when it's my time to go, just drag me into the garden and let the sextons do their job.

VERBICIDE

Why do I find the history of individual words so fascinating? And why do I want to share it with you? Mostly because I think that the changing use of words helps us to remember that meanings change and we who complain about the pronunciation or the grammar or the modern meanings used by younger people need to remind ourselves that language is not static.

It is very hard to predict the changes. An American university teacher in the sixties once told us that the then modern trend in conversation to use the word man as a conjunction like and or but would become more and more prevalent and the new meaning would become commonplace. That did not happen. He did not predict the current use of the words absolutely or great. I used to hate the grumpy and apathetic use of the word wha'ever but that seems to have become a bit less frequently used. I hope that the meaningless peppering of quite ordinary sentences with the word like will disappear too. And the equally meaningless use of the response to all sorts of situations: No problem


The word I have been investigating is NICE. It's a word I often use about the weather and people and houses. It seems to be used more by women than men and used less and less by young people.

The history of the word nice surprised me. Its origin is the Late Latin word nescius meaning ignorant. It was used in Old French meaning silly and before 1300 was used in Middle English to mean foolish. Over the years it came to mean easygoing and then in the late 1700s agreeable and delightful. By 1830 it had come to include thoughtful.

Unexpectedly, at the same time a quite different meaning developed whereby nice was also used to mean fussy or fastidious and later on precise or punctilious. It was used with this meaning in phrases such as That's a nice point you are making or That's a nice distinction. This use seems very old-fashioned nowadays.

I think the word verbicide (which sounds rather like a gardening product) really means the killing off of the meanings of words not of the words themselves.

Meanings come and meanings go but words go on forever! Absolutely! No problem!
