#### Pett Parish Council

I am pleased to say that Jan Tomalin was co-opted to the council at an extraordinary meeting in December. You can find out more about Jan and what she has done, and it is still doing, by going to https://abbasmedialaw.com/jan-tomalin/. I am sure that the council will benefit greatly from her experience and expertise. And, though I probably shouldn't say it, it is good to have a female presence on the council once again.

The main reason that the council met in December was to consider the budget for the year 2024/25. This has to be submitted to the District Council by the end of January. At present, it looks as though the parish council precept will remain the same as in the current year, which, as I often point out, is less than a pound a week for a band D property. However, as discussed below, if some responsibility for the Pett Level toilets is assumed by the parish council, then it may be necessary to increase the precept.

With regard to the toilets, a letter was sent to the chief executive of Rother protesting about the planned closure of the toilets and asking the district council to reconsider its decision. The letter noted that there were no alternative facilities in Pett Level and also drew attention to the petition that had nearly 400 names on it protesting about the closure. The letter also pointed out that the closure could be considered as discrimination against women and the elderly, both of which groups have a particular need of the facilities provided by a public toilet. No response has been received as yet. A copy of the full letter can be seen at www.pettnet.org.uk/parish-council/pett-level-toilets.

A further online meeting was held with the staff member at Rother District Council responsible for this issue and she tentatively put forward the suggestion of sharing the cost of the toilets between the district and parish councils. However, the parish council representatives insisted that no move would be considered until a reply to the council's letter had been received. In addition, they felt that a review of the condition of the toilets and of the cost of running them should be undertaken and appropriate action taken where necessary. In particular, it is clear that the cesspit is emptied every other week, but it is not clear how many litres of sewage are removed each time.

There are many initiatives being undertaken at various levels to try and mitigate the effects of flood water at Pett Level. More about these in future reports.

On a different topic, although one that can be seen to be related, the district council has been urging parish councils to declare a climate emergency and look at establishing initiatives that will help reduce the effects of climate change. At present, the parish council has not decided to make this move as it is not clear what initiatives can be undertaken. Dr Lucie Bolton, Environment Strategy Officer at Rother, gave a presentation at the Rother parish conference and suggested a few, such as car clubs, electric vehicle charging points, promoting cycling, community food growing schemes, repair hubs and library of things, food waste reduction and community composting. Are any of these practical for Pett or are there others that you can suggest? We are hoping to put more information into next month's parish news, but, if you have any ideas, please contact Councillor David Tasker or myself.

I regret to say that I have to report four deaths this month. First, David Martin, who has been a supporter of the Independent Rescue Boat for many years. Then Sue Colgate, a member of one of the village's oldest families, Terry Cuthbert, who was active in a number of village activities, and finally the husband of Sally Watson, President of the Pett WI. Our sympathy goes to all the bereaved families.

## **New Year Resolutions**

My New Year resolutions don't seem to last very long unless they are ones which require no effort at all. I imagine the same can be said of many other people's resolutions. One of the problems, I think, is the length of the year ahead. It seems easier to give something up for the six weeks of Lent than to resolve to do something for a whole year.

So, I was wondering about the origin of the custom of making New Year resolutions on  $1^{st}$  January and here is what I found out:

The earliest recorded resolutions were made by the Babylonians in 2000 BC. It was the start of their farming season, and it was customary to make promises to pay debts and to return borrowed farming equipment.

The Romans adopted the custom and made promises to the god Janus, after whom January is named.

Christianity started to hold watchnight services on New Year's Eve and pray for forgiveness for the wrongs of the previous year, as well as God's blessing on the plans for the year ahead. The Methodists hold a covenant service in January affirming their relationship with God.

In the Jewish festival of Rosh Hashanah there is reflection on wrongdoing, and they seek and offer forgiveness.

New Year resolutions became much more common by the beginning of the nineteenth century and the phrase New Year Resolution was first used in a U.S. newspaper in 1813. Subsequently the idea was satirized, and suggestions made about what the resolutions should be of various politicians and other public figures.

What does all this tell us? Perhaps, that many people like making plans and many have a wish to improve, and there is everlasting optimism that such improvement is attainable. It's just as well, I suppose, that most of us do not disclose too widely our New Year Resolutions!

#### **Nature Notes**

Artificial intelligence (AI) seems to have been getting some bad press recently. Some consider that it will be making better decisions than human beings and will take over the world and make us all redundant. There are concerns that because of the way it works, it is not possible to find out how an answer has been arrived at, and whether or not there was some bias, intentional or otherwise, in the data used to train the system. There are also concerns that students may use applications like ChatGPT to finish their assignments. But there are a number of AI applications now available, that can be very helpful in identifying species in the natural world.

I have been using one such application called ObsIdentify. (Other applications such as Google Lens, Seek, PlantNet for plants only, and Merlin which identifies birds by sight or by their song are available.) The applications all work in a similar way - when you open the application on your smart-phone, it invites you to take one or more photos of what you are trying to identify, and then it tells you what it is. Sometimes it may offer several possibilities, each with a percentage as an indication of how likely the identification is to



be correct. I have been using ObsIdentify to go back through my vast collection of plant and animal photos to see if AI can help me to identify things that I couldn't identify at the time, either because of the time required to trawl through field guides to find the right insect, or just plain lack of knowing where to start.

On the whole, it has been successful in identifying a large number of species. Some groups like moths, for example, can be readily identified from photographs. Micro-moths can also be identified, but the difference between individual species can be quite small, and with more than 1,000 images in the field guide, it gets quite bewildering searching through them. Obsidentify will take me to 2 or 3 images on the same page, then I can read up about each species to see which answer to believe. Obsidentify does get things wrong, sometimes spectacularly wrong, for example, identifying a beetle as a cranefly, but sometimes it is 100% confident, though only nearly right, which is more worrying. Fortunately, I don't have to believe the answers that Obsidentify gives me. I do the best I can to check each answer in field guides or the Internet, before entering it on iRecord where proper (human) experts will verify or reject the record as appropriate.

Though going back through my collection has been (and still is) a time-consuming exercise, the breadth and quality of it has increased. It has also meant that I have found a lot of images of beautiful and interesting creatures that I have seen since moving to Pett, that I had otherwise forgotten about. I'm hoping to put some of the images on Pett Nature Facebook and WhatsApp groups soon. I will start with the stunning Lime Hawkmoth shown above - pure velvet.

Pennette au Gratin

#### (Grated pennette pasta)

The origins of this recipe are lost in time. This dish was introduced into Italy, specifically into Sicily, around the 19<sup>th</sup> century by the Arabs, under their domination of the island. Soon after it spread from Sicily to Calabria, Puglia, Basilicata, and Campania regions, reaching the centre and the north of Italy.

In my house, my sister and my mum used to cook this dish when they had leftovers of cheeses and other ingredients. Even now every time I prepare it, it evokes warm and nostalgic memories of my family.

(For 4 people)

250g pennette pasta 500g courgettes 140g mascarpone cheese 100g of brie (more or less) 50g pancetta or smoked bacon 40g grated parmesan cheese Some basil leaves. Extra virgin olive oil. Salt and black pepper.

Boil a pan of salted water and preheat the oven to 200 Celsius. Peel and chop the courgettes. Heat the oil in a non-stick pan and slowly brown the pancetta, then add the courgettes, season and cook for 10 minutes. Meanwhile, cook the pennette in the pan of salted water in line with the instructions on the packet, but 3-4 minutes less than the instructions (the pasta must be undercooked as it finishes its cooking time in the oven).

Drain the pasta and add it to the mixture of ingredients in the non-stick pan. Stir and remove from the heat. Add the mascarpone and the basil leaves, season and mix well.

Pour everything into an oven casserole, and add the brie chopped into small pieces, sprinkle with parmesan cheese and then bake for 15 minutes (more or less) in the preheated oven at 200 Celsius until golden brown, and as usual:

#### I got you under my skin

I like to think that most of us are good neighbours to the wild animals we share this planet with. We feed the birds, grow flowers in the garden for bees and butterflies. But if wildlife gets too close or, heaven forbid, enters our houses we're reaching for the fly spray or a rolled-up newspaper. I get plenty of people complaining to me about home-invading wildlife as if I'm some sort of envoy for the animal kingdom. Yet while they moan about clothes moths in their wardrobe, I just stand there smiling, reassured by the knowledge that these people have wildlife living right under their noses. Well, to be more precise, right in their noses.

OK, I warn you now: after reading this article some of you will be scouring your face with a Brillo pad. But it's time to face the facts. Your face is crawling with animals. You, yes you, have face mites. And there's no 'might' about it - research has shown that 100% of adults have them. Our faces are one big nature reserve for mites: from your mountainous nose and skin pore caves to your eyelash jungles. In fact, our faces are home to two different species. *Demodex folliculorum* thrive in your eyelashes while *Demodex brevis* lurk in your pores. They're feeding on dead skin cells and oils but don't harm us - a commensal parasite.

Before you run to the bathroom mirror, these guys are tiny. I'm not going to lie to you, they're not pretty (unless you think a microscopic 8-legged slug is pretty) and under high-powered microscopes they look like something you'd encounter in a galaxy far, far away. The egg and larval stages last two weeks and you'll probably be relieved to hear that the adults live for just five days and then die. And it's right about here you'll realise that these things are constantly mating on your face. You can scrub and scrub, but you can't wash away the hard truth: you're just a mammal. And like dogs, cows, orangutans and meerkats we're the perfect hosts for a range of parasites.

Personally, I've grown quite fond of my little pets - despite never being able to see them. When I go to bed at night, I imagine Clarence the Demodex, climbing from his pore, going for a wander across my cheek and hoping to meet a girlfriend. But instead, he meets his nemesis Evil Arthur, and a mite fight ensues until ...well, you get the idea. There are hundreds of these little adventures happening on your face every night. Sweet dreams.


